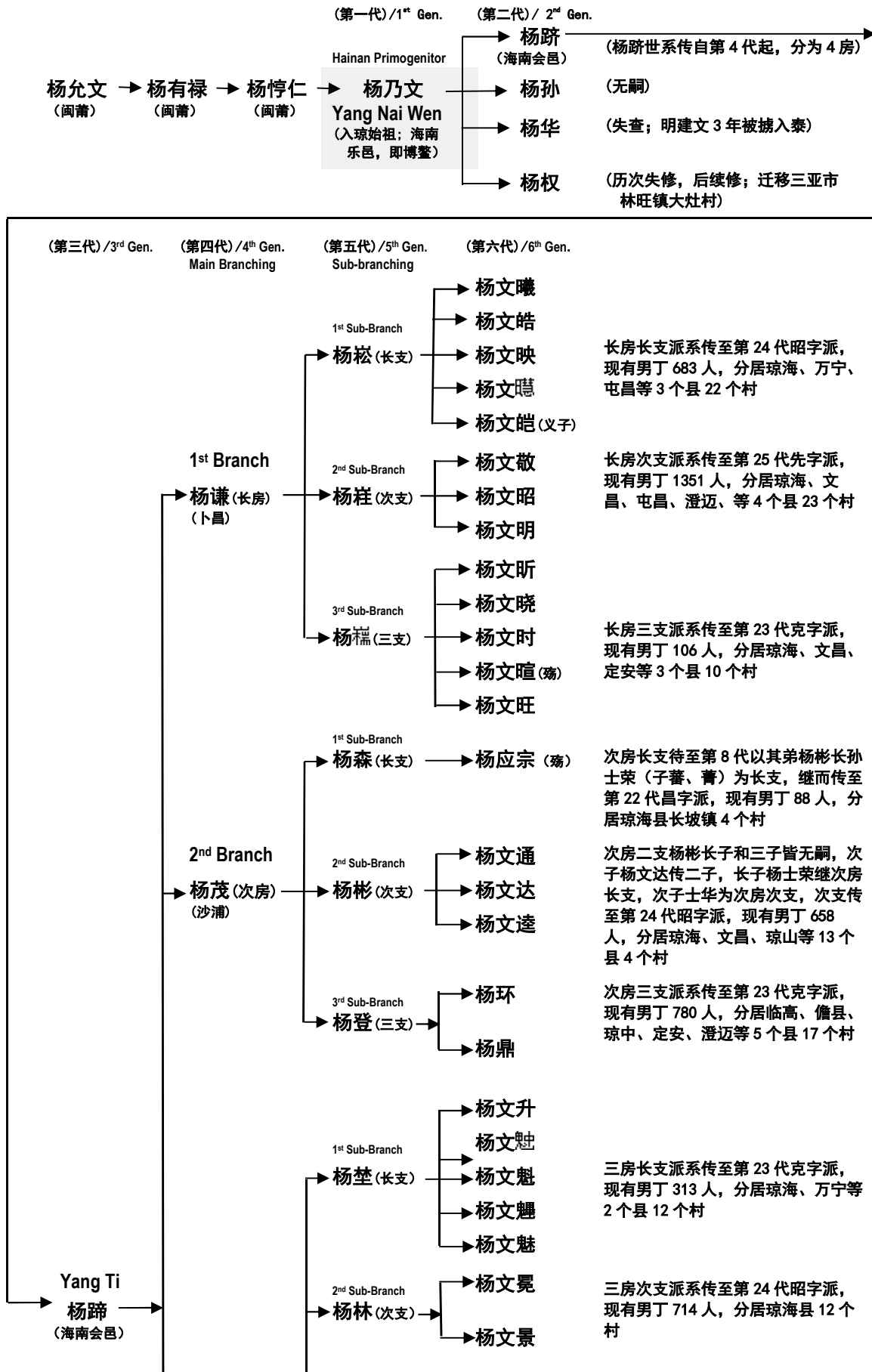
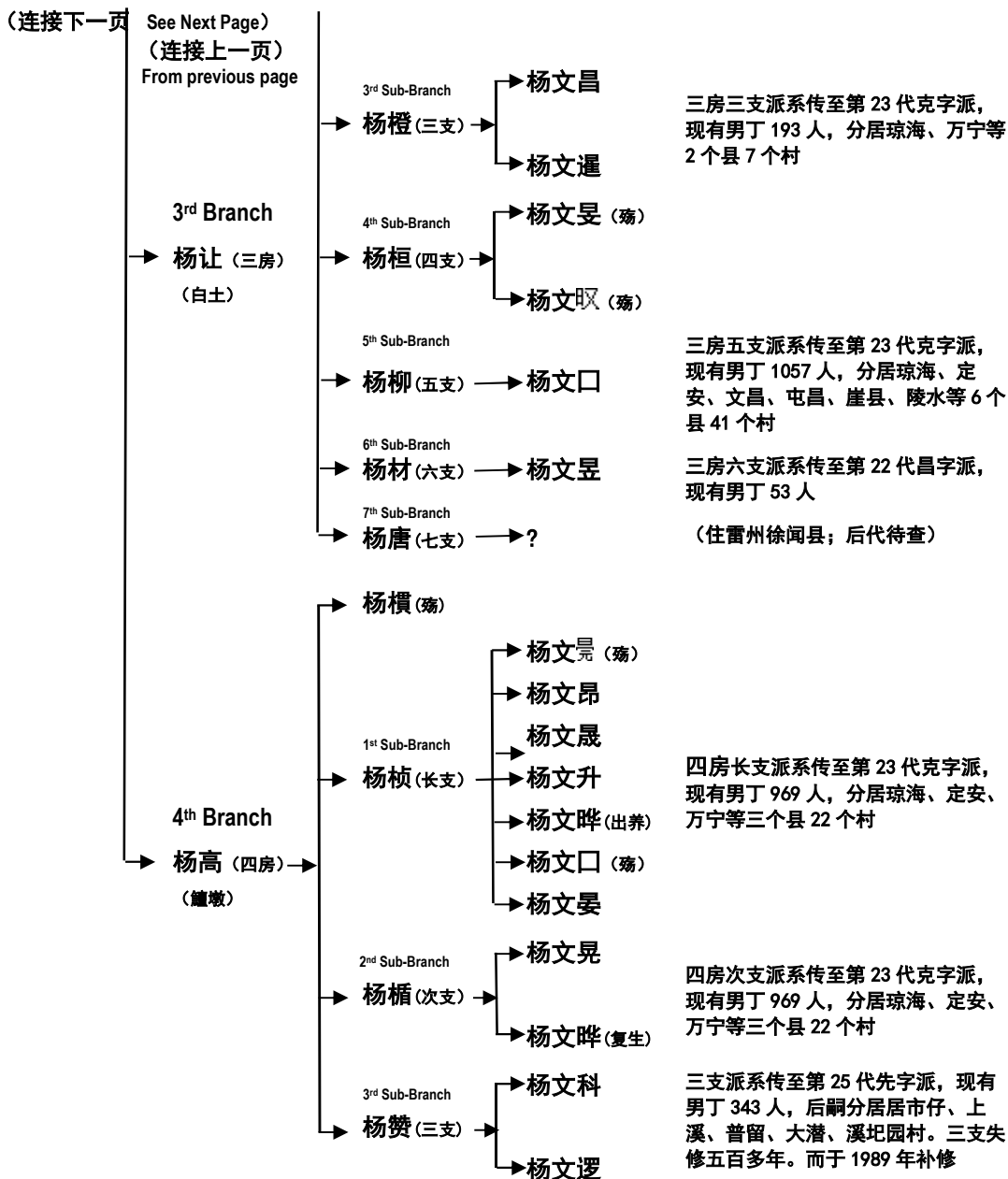


海南省琼海市载德堂入琼始祖杨乃文初期繁衍脉络

The Initial Genealogical Lineage of Yang Nai Wen (Hainan Primogenitor)





入琼始祖杨乃文公，携独子杨跻谪居海南。第二代杨跻生四子，其中二子杨孙无嗣，三子杨华失查，四子杨权后裔失修，只有长子杨蹄（第三代）繁衍派系记录最全。杨蹄生四子，第四代分为四房：长房入籍卜昌村、再分三支，次房迁沙浦二岭村、分三支，三房入籍白土村、分七支，四房入籍鱣墩村、分三支。这就是海南杨氏族谱里记录《房、支》的由来。

Our Hainan ancestor Yang Nai Wen had only one son, Yang Ji (杨跻). Yang Ji had four sons. Of his four sons, the lineage of the other three sons were, however, lost or missing. Only Yang Ji's eldest son, Yang Ti (杨蹄) had his descendants' genealogical record maintained. Yang Ti also had 4 sons, each of whom settled in different parts of Hainan, whom consequently producing 4 branches of genealogical lineages. The First branch domiciled in Bo Chang (卜昌村), which further produced 3 sub-branches; the Second branch settled in Sha Pu Er Ling (沙浦二岭村), subdivided into 3 sub-branches; the Third branch settled in Bai Tu (白土村), subdivided into 7 sub-branches; the Fourth branch settled in Shan Dun (鱣墩村), subdivided into 3 sub-branches. That is the origin of the "Branch-Sub-branch" terminology used in the Hainan Yang Genealogy Records.
